# 1. Our behaviour system

## Positives

## 2. Pupil voice



We have school council assemblies (usually led by the Year 6 children) so that we can hear what the pupils want and the different choices they make.

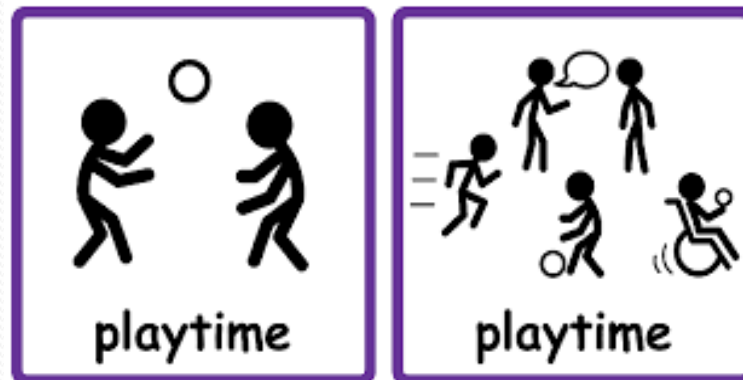
You may be wondering how we get the pupils to vote on what they want in assemblies...
